Outer Islands

- Quarantine control for cane toads, cats, dogs, rats, pest ants and weeds.
- Rapid response for cane toad, black rat or cat invasions.
- Survey for rare or threatened wildlife.
- Monitor threatened mammal populations: Wan'kurra (Golden Bandicoot), Barkuma (Northern Quoll) and Limbilimbi (Rabbit-rat).
- Patrol for unauthorised boat landings.
- Limit wildfire.

Inner Islands

- Control or eradicate feral pigs.
- Control and contain pest ants.
- Surveillance for serious weeds.
- Control and contain grassy weeds and weedy garden plants.
- Support customary burning practices.
- Promote protection of marine turtles and customary hunting.

Mainland Areas

- Control feral animals at key sites.
- Reduce fuel loads.
- Limit wildfire.
- Support homelands burning practices.
- Monitor for outbreaks of serious weeds.
